# Literacy

This term we will be reading a range of texts including The Arrival, Macbeth, The Highway Man and topic related non-fiction texts. Pupils will write for a range of purposes: to Entertain, Inform, Persuade and Discuss. The study of Shakespeare's Macbeth will also incorporate drama.

#### R.E

In the Spring Term, pupils will explore the resurrection of Jesus and what this means to Christianity as a whole. They will explore what Salvation is and why this is significant with the Christian faith. We will also be exploring the 5 Pillars of Islam and how these influence people's life.

## Numeracy

In Numeracy, pupils will cover a range of mathematical topics, with the aim of consolidating their understanding of place value and the written methods, before moving onto fractions, decimals and percentages.

Pupils will have the chance to solve multi-step problems whilst also aiming to reason and explain their findings.

powered robots.






#### Science




# Computing
